Dr. Corbet was nominated to serve as chairman. The Committee will work during the next few months to review the City Charter.

Review of promotional materials was the primary focus of the BBC's meeting last week. The sample recycle brochure was accepted unanimously. To promote the household waste program, a doorknob hanger rather than a brochure will be produced at this time. A final version of that product and a revised version of the tree walk brochure, both incorporating suggested changes, will be reviewed at next month's meeting. Chair Deborah Chaney mentioned the possibility of acquiring outside assistance with printing or printing costs.

Commission members will be assisting with traffic control related to the City's paper shredding event Saturday Oct. 27, 8 a.m.-noon. It is expected that materials will be shredded in the presence of the person who brings them.

Commissioners voted unanimously to have a bid package put together for the building of a greenhouse. James Hughes, Director of Parks and Recreation and Special Events, said that bids probably would be due in January.

Ms. Chaney announced that the Beautification Commission Award for the Fort Worth Community Credit Union will be presented at that building Saturday Nov. 3, 9 a.m. It was noted that the Bedford building is headquarters for that business.

The Commission's next Workday will be Saturday Oct. 20, and the one after that will
